Disney CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM – Summer 2024

The Disney Cultural Exchange Program (Summer Work Experience) is a three-month experience located at *Walt Disney World*® Resort, near Orlando, Florida. Participants of this program have the opportunity to develop real world experience while working in front line roles at our Theme Parks and Resort Hotels. This experience provides international students the opportunity to spend their summer break working at *Walt Disney World* Resort experiencing the Disney magic.

To participate in the Cultural Exchange Program, you must be:

- Speak English fluently
- Be at least 18 years of age to apply
- Be receptive to [Disney Look](#) guidelines
- You must be fully available to work Sunday through Saturday, including days and nights, holidays and overtime
- Applicants must be currently enrolled full time and pursuing a degree at an accredited post-secondary, classroom-based academic institution physically located outside the United States
- Have successfully completed at least one semester, or equivalent, of post-secondary academic study.

Program Dates

- Dates of Disney Program: **May 20nd, 2024 – August 15th, 2024 (tentative)**

Pay Rate

- Pay rates start at **\$16.00 USD/hour** - minimum of 30 hours per week

J1 Visa – Sponsored by Disney

Participants are responsible for:

- Sevis Fee - \$35 USD (approximate)
- Visa Processing Fee - \$185 USD (approximate)

Medical Insurance

- Students are required to purchase medical insurance for the duration of the program prior to traveling to the USA (more information will be provided at a later date).

Housing Costs

- **\$202 to \$246 USD** per week, depending on the type of the apartment.
- **Program Participation Fee is \$442 USD** (this **one-time, non-refundable fee** includes):
 - Activities and Fees (**\$240 USD**) - helps support the administration, events and activities scheduled in the housing complex throughout the program.
 - Housing fee (**\$202 USD**) – a portion of this amount will be applied to the participant's housing cost during the first week of the program.
- Transportation provided to and from work at no cost
- All complexes are gated with on-site security

Airfare

- Participants are responsible for their round-trip flights to and from the USA.

Disney International Programs Role Checklist - Cultural Exchange Program

The following roles may be available as part of Disney International Programs. The descriptions below provide an overview of the responsibilities included in each role. It is important to note that each role may include, but is not limited to, the description below.

Quick Service Food and Beverage

- Selling food and beverages at outdoor carts and/or indoor restaurants
- Taking and filling orders, multi-tasking
- Preparing food items in a kitchen area, including the use of a fryer, grill, broiler and other industrial cooking equipment
- Preparing, handling and serving food products including but not limited to meat, meat products, pork, shellfish, egg, dairy, gluten, soy, and nut products
- Cash handling - both manual and using computerized registers
- Bussing tables, cleaning kitchen and counter equipment and emptying trash cans
- Dispensing and selling alcoholic beverages
- Setting and stocking tables, outdoor cars and restaurants
- Heavy lifting, pushing heavy carts
- Working with cleaning chemicals
- Working independently or as part of a large team
- Standing for extended periods, working outdoors

Merchandise

- Demonstrating and selling merchandise (including alcohol and tobacco) in indoor and outdoor areas
- Cash handling - manual and using computerized registers
- Stocking and cleaning shelves and carts
- Receiving/putting away stock and deliveries
- Stroller/wheelchair rental – including repetitive lifting, stacking and pushing strollers and wheelchairs
- Preparation of food/candy
- Preparing packages for shipping/delivery

Attractions

- Working at one or more of the "rides" or theater shows
- Loading and unloading Guests from attractions
- Operating sophisticated ride systems
- Memorizing and delivering lengthy narrations to large groups
- Monitoring Guest flow and providing a safe Guest experience
- Retrieving and arranging strollers and assisting with audience control, including during parades
- Assisting with emergency evacuations of attractions when necessary
- Working with FASTPASS®, the ticketing system that distributes attraction ride times

- Working at one or more of the following locations: parking, park greeter, ticket operations, and toll plaza areas
- Greeting all Guests who enter the park, and validating their tickets
- Selling various ticket media at our water parks, Disney Springs or ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex
- Strong knowledge of Walt Disney World® Resort ticket media
- Using computerized ticketing systems

Seater

- Greeting and seating Guests in restaurants
- Managing a seating chart and resolving Guest situations
- Utilizing a computerized reservation/seating system
- Cash handling - both manual and using computerized registers
- Rolling silverware, folding napkins, and keeping area stocked
- Light cleaning, multi-tasking

Lifeguard

- Monitoring Guest's safety in water and on slide/attractions
- Physically challenging work and prolonged exposure to outside elements
- Providing first aid and basic life support in the event of Guest injury or illness
- Ability to detect and respond to noises and distress signals in an aquatic environment, including in the water and anywhere around the zone of responsibility
- Must be able to observe all sections of an assigned zone or area of responsibility
- Strong swimming skills
- During off-peak seasons, assisting other operating areas throughout the Walt Disney World® Resort, including performing roles other than lifeguarding

Custodial

- High Guest interaction while working independently
- Extensive cleaning - including restrooms and toilets
- Working with cleaning chemicals and equipment
- Bussing tables in restaurants and outdoors
- Sweeping and mopping
- Emptying trash cans, lifting heavy garbage bags
- Driving pargo carts
- Vacuuming, dusting, and cleaning pool decks

Character Attendant

- Providing Guests with information about show schedules, character locations and visitation times
- Providing audience control, including handling challenging Guest situations
- Ensuring the safety of Character Performers and our Guests
- Partnering with Photopass photographers
- Maintaining show quality and character integrity
- Proactively interacting with our Guests by involving them in the Characters' story
- Setting up and removing stanchions, ropes and poles
- Assisting Character Performers with putting on costumes
- Retrieving and arranging strollers

Recreation Attractions

- Assisting Guests in one or more recreational areas such as waterslide operations, towel rental, watercraft rental, marina operations, arcades or resort recreational facilities
- Prolonged exposure to outside weather elements
- Strong swimming skills
- Providing first aid and basic life support in the event of injury or illness
- Keeping recreational areas clean
- Cash handling - both manual and using computerized registers
- Maintaining safety standards
- During off-peak seasons, assisting other operating areas throughout the Walt Disney World Resort

All roles also include exposure to outside elements including, heat/humidity, cold temperatures, and/or wet conditions, prolonged standing and walking and keeping work areas clean.
